## July August September

- General maintenance pruning of all shrubs in the front and sides of homes **begins July 6.**Tag--with the colored tape provided--any shrub(s) you do not want pruned. A separate pruning and treatment project for elaeagnus affected with fungus will begin at least two weeks later; you will be notified of the starting date before it begins. As always, <u>please do not interrupt the Ruppert workers with any special requests or issues; contact Hope Weber or Peggy Akers with your comments.</u>
- In light of continuing health concerns, the Board of Directors, with the assistance of our attorney, has decided to alter the shape of the Annual General Meeting required by Article V, §1 in the <a href="Bylaws">Bylaws</a>. We could not in good conscience assemble what would be more than fifty mature residents inside one room to partake in a lot of talking—you remember our Gathering Place meetings in early November and see why that would not work today.

We will follow the standard practice of mailing you a packet containing an explanation and cover sheet, annual reports from standing committees, a proposed budget, and a status report on the Reserve account. As usual, this year's packet will also include a slate of nominees proposed by the Nominating Committee and their bios, but this year the packet will also include a ballot for the two open Director seats that you were formerly given when you registered at the door at the beginning of the meeting. The <u>Bylaws</u> require a written secret ballot, and you can fulfill that obligation by depositing your completed ballot in the Weathersfield mailbox in the mail kiosk we all use <u>not later than October 31</u>. Or, you can mail your completed ballot to Mill House Properties by the same day.

In addition, we ask all residents who have questions for the Board or concerns they wish to share with us to email them to any director or officer at your earliest convenience, but **not later than October 31** so that we can respond to these questions on the website after November 6.

All of us have had to manage many, not necessarily desirable, changes in our lives these days. We are convinced that what we will miss from an in-person gathering is not as mortant as the health and safety of our neighbors.
